WHEREAS, Padre Pio of Pietrelcina, now St. Pio, developed CSS as a "Clinic for the body and the soul" to serve Jesus in the poor and the sick, under the mandate of complete obedience to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church and its moral and ethical teachings on healthcare; and,

WHEREAS, it was the expressed vision of the founders of CSS that it be: "...the first link in a great chain. It should be the model for many other, innumerable Casas with the same name, and above all the same spirit, which must bring Love to all of humanity."; and,

WHEREAS, CHI was incorporated with the primary mission and vision to join CSS in implementing this vision to expand the network of Casa's in various locations around the world; and,

WHEREAS, CHI and CSS have entered into this Collaboration Agreement for the purpose of forming a Collaboration Team that will ultimately make recommendations regarding the development of more hospitals throughout the world with the same name and same spirit as the Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza.
